- 1. He was scourged, Mt. 27:26, Mk. 15:15, Jn. 19:1
- 2. Wore a crown of thorns, Mt. 27:29, Mk. 15:17, Jn. 19:2
- 3. Beat Him in the face, Jn. 19:3
- 4. Beat Him an head with reed, Mt. 27:30, Mk. 15:19
- 5. Jesus bore His own cross, Jn. 19:17
- 6. He was crucified, Mt. 27:31, Mk. 15:15, Lk. 23:33, Jn. 19:18
- 7. Pierced side with spear, blood and water came forth, Jn. 19:31-34, 36, 37
- 8. John was an eye witness, Jn. 20:25
- 9. Jesus was guarded at the cross, Mt. 27:54
- 10. Pilate checked with centurion to be sure Jesus was dead, Mk. 15:44,45
- 11. His body was wrapped, Mt. 27:59, Mk. 15:46, Lk. 23:53, Jn. 19:39,40
- 12. Wrapped with 75 lbs. of aloes and myrrh, Jn. 19:39
- 13. He was placed in a tomb cut out of rock, Mt. 27:60, Mk. 15:46
- 14. Placed a large stone in front of the tomb, Mt. 27:60, Mk. 15:46
- 15. Stone too large for four women to roll away, Mk. 16:1, 3
- 16. Two Marys saw where Jesus was buried, Mt. 27:61, Mk. 15:47, Lk. 23:55
- 17. On Saturday, the Chief Priests and Pharisees asked Pilate for a guard to ID.-- placed at the tomb, Pilate agreed, Mt. 27:62-66
- 18. Set a seal on the stone, Mt. 27:66
- 19. Stone was rolled away (by the angel), Jn. 20:1, Mt. 28:2, Mk. 16:4, Lk. 24:2
- 20. Guards shook for fear at the sight of the angel, Mt. 28-4
- 21. Jesus had prophesied about the resurrection, Lk. 24:6-8
- 22. Jesus appeared to the women, Mt. 28:8-10
- 23. Soldiers were bribed to lie, Mt. 28:11-15
- 24. Disciples refused to believe women's reports, Mk. 16:11, Lk. 24:11, or other's report, Mk. 16:13
- 25. Linen wrappings left in the tomb, Luke 24:12, Jn. 20:5-7, (face- cloth by itself).
- 26. Jesus rebukes them for their unbelief, Mk. 16:14
- 27. Prophesies had spoken of it, Lk. 24:25-27,44, Jn. 20:9
- 28. Mary clung to Jesus, Jn. 20:17
- 29. They could touch Jesus, Lk. 24:39, (Thomas) Jn. 21:27
- 30. He ate a piece of boiled fish, Lk. 24:41-43
- 31. Jesus' burial was honorable according to Jewish customs.
- 32. Jews would never dishonor a loved one by moving their corpse.
- 33. Ten of the eleven apostles died for the testimony of Jesus. After the crucifixion the disciples were scattered and defeated.

FIVE THEORIES TO EXPLAIN AWAY THE RESURRECTION

- 1. The Disciples stole the body of Jesus.
- 2. Swoon Theory: Jesus did not actually die but "swooned" and was resuscitated in the cool tomb.
- 3. Wrong tomb: The women got the tomb mixed up.
- 4. Phantom: These appearances were actually mental images of people who wanted Jesus back.
- 5. The resurrection was actually a myth that developed over time.
